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1 Introduction

Congratulations on your purchase of the Zoom™ OMAP34x-II Mobile Development Platform (MDP). The Zoom OMAP34x-II MDP addresses essential needs of the open-source community and high-level operating system (HLOS) developers to speed software development for smartphones and Mobile Internet Devices (MIDs).

1.1 Development Platform Contents

The Zoom OMAP34x-II MDP includes the following items:

- +Handheld
 - +Integrated SOM-LV featuring Texas Instruments' OMAP3430 processor
 - +4.1" WVGA LCD
 - +QWERTY keypad
- +Debug board
- +Power supply with US, UK, Japan, and Europe power adapters
- +USB A-to-Mini-B cable
- +QuickStart Guide

Figure 2.1 – Handheld Features (Front)

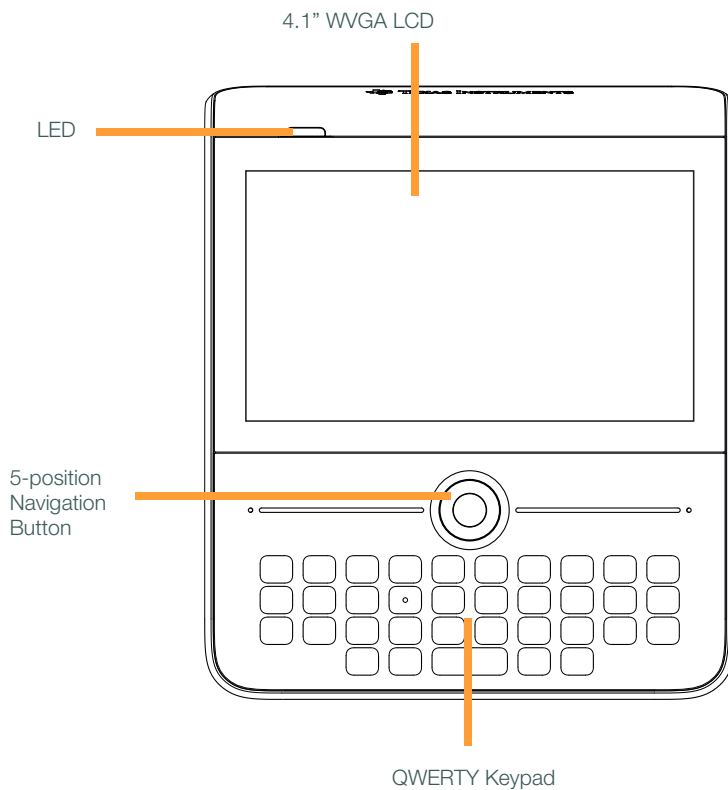


Figure 2.2 – Handheld Features (Bottom)

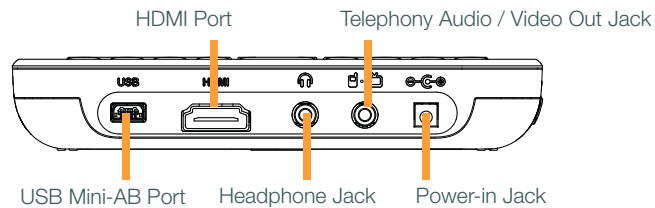


Figure 2.3 – Handheld Features (Side)

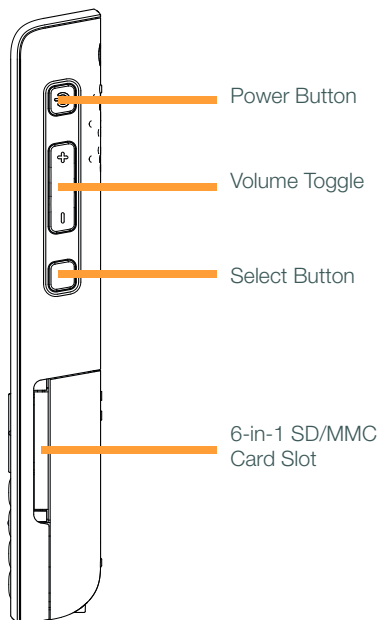


Figure 2.4 – Handheld Features (Back / Covers Removed)

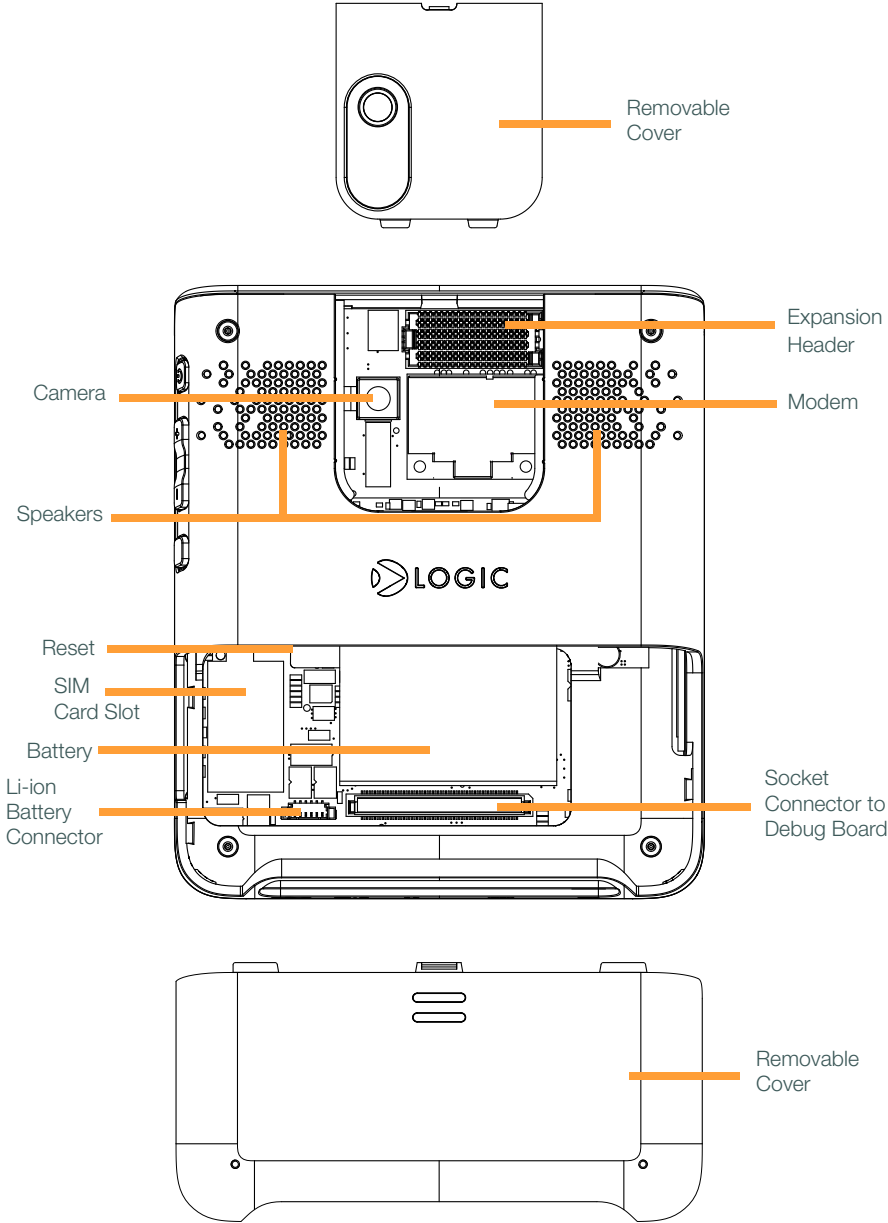
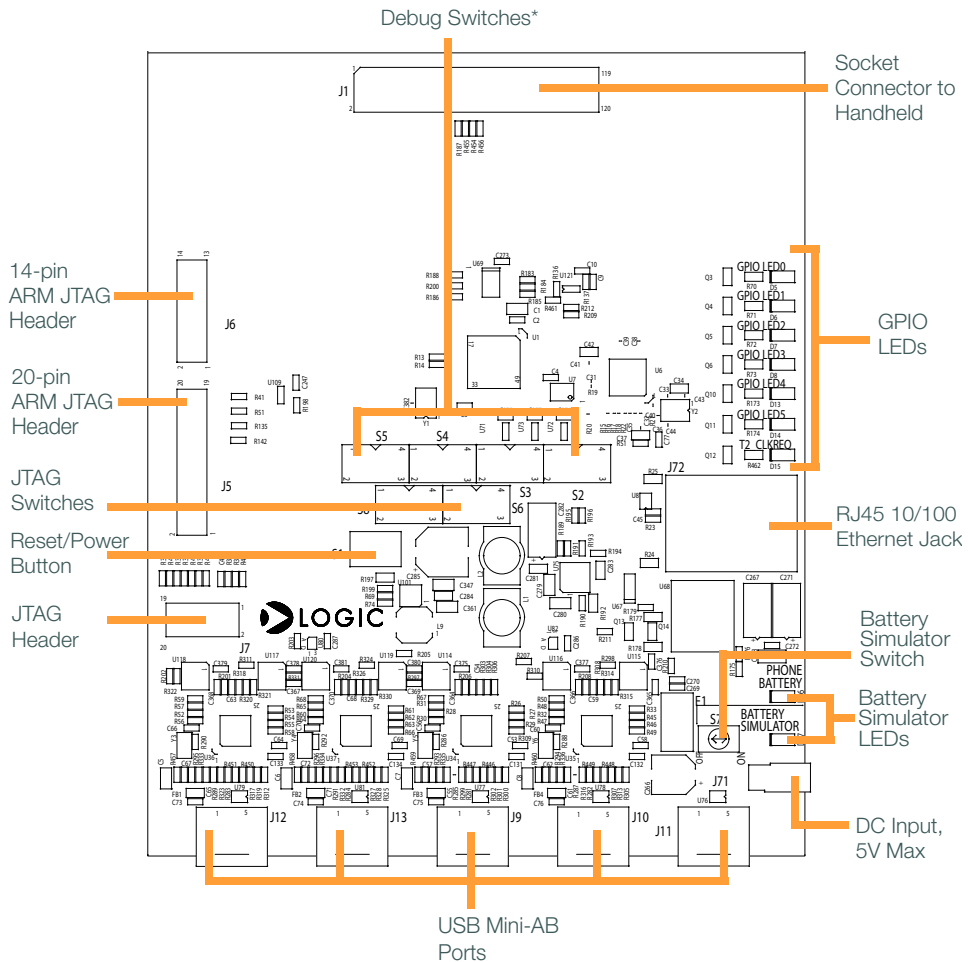


Figure 2.5 – Debug Board Features



***NOTE:** Information about debug switch settings is silkscreened on the bottom of the debug board and can also be found in the debug board schematics.

3 Setup

3.1 Connecting the Debug Board

To connect the debug board to the handheld:

1. Remove the bottom cover on the back of the handheld.
2. Align the keyed socket connector with the mating connector on the debug board (see Figure 2.4 and Figure 2.5 for connector locations).
3. Press down over the connectors.
4. Verify the connectors have mated properly.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The DC Input jack on the debug board can be used to power the handheld and the debug board for general use. However, using the DC Input jack on the debug board will not charge the handheld battery. Never have more than one power supply connected to the Zoom OMAP34x-II MDP at any given moment.

3.2 Getting to a U-Boot Prompt

1. Verify the debug board is connected to the handheld.
2. Make sure the power switch (S7) on the debug board is in the “OFF” position.
3. Connect the regulated 5V power supply to the appropriate power adapter for the region in which you are using the development platform.

4. Plug the power adapter into an electrical outlet and the 5V line to the DC input connector on the debug board.

NOTE: Detailed instructions for Steps 5–10 can be found in a readme available on Logic’s website (<http://support.logicpd.com/downloads/1206/>). Please refer to the readme if you encounter any difficulty with the following steps.

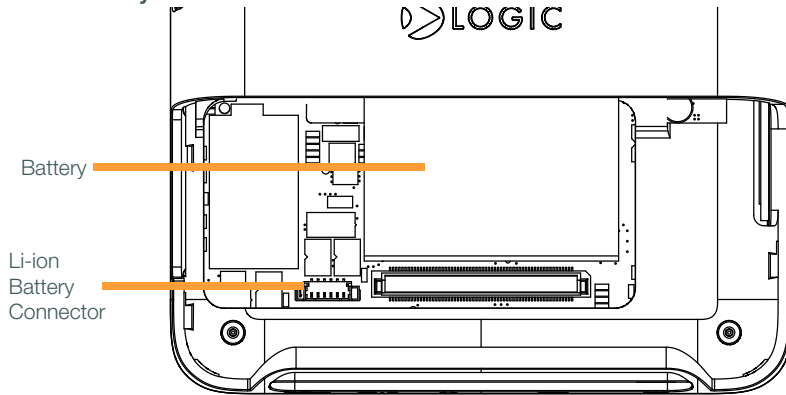
5. Download the FT2232 VCP driver from the FTDI website www.ftdichip.com/Drivers/VCP.htm
6. Connect the included USB cable to the USB mini-AB connector labeled J12 on the debug board and to a USB port on your development PC.
7. Windows should recognize your new hardware.
8. Open the Device Manager on your computer to determine what COM port number was assigned to the USB-to-Serial connection.
9. Launch your terminal emulation program. (Although Logic does not support any particular terminal emulation program, we suggest using Tera Term Pro for Windows 2000 or XP, which can be downloaded from Logic’s website at: <http://support.logicpd.com/downloads/240/>).
10. Open a new serial port connection in your terminal emulation program with the following settings:
 - +Port: COM port number found in Step 8 above
 - +Baud rate: 115200
 - +Data: 8-bit
 - +Parity: none
 - +Stop: 1-bit
 - +Flow control: none
11. Move the power switch (S7) on the debug board to the “ON” position. The handheld LED should display a blue light and then a red light. After the red light displays, a Zoom2 # U-Boot prompt should appear in your terminal emulation program.
12. You are now able to communicate with your handheld.

3.3 Connecting the Battery

The handheld comes with an 1100 mAh Li-ion battery installed, but not connected. Follow the steps below to connect the battery.

1. With the back of the handheld facing you, remove the bottom cover and locate the Li-ion battery connector on the baseboard PCB (see Figure 3.2).

2. Align the end of the battery cable over the connector and make sure the side-tabs of the connectors align properly.
3. Fully insert the connector.

3.4 Charging the Battery

The power supply included with the Zoom OMAP34x-II MDP can be used to charge the battery.

1. Connect the regulated 5V power supply to the appropriate power adapter for the region in which you are using the development platform.
2. Plug the power adapter into an electrical outlet and the 5V line output connector into the power-in jack on the bottom of the handheld (see Figure 2.2 for power-in jack location).

IMPORTANT NOTE: To charge the battery, update the U-Boot or X-Loader software to the latest version available from <http://www.omapzoom.org>. Once the software has been updated, you must connect the power supply to the power-in jack on the bottom of the handheld to charge the battery; plugging the power supply into the debug board will not charge the battery.
